
How to book a school trip

Attraction price guide


We've rounded up our top tried & tested attractions so you can customise your school trip itinerary.

Brandenburg Gate

One of the most recognisable German landmarks, Brandenburg Gate was a symbol of Berlin and German division during the Cold War, it is now a national symbol of peace and unity.

Berlin Hohenschönhausen Memorial

This former STASI prison offers an unflinching look at life in former East Germany. Much of it remains unchanged, complete with interrogation rooms, cells & gun towers.



Berlin Wall Memorial

Visit the longest remaining section of the Berlin wall, which was torn down in 1989, a watchtower and "Death strip", where attempted escapes ended fatally. Take a guided tour to get the most out of your time.

Sachsenhausen Memorial and Museum

A visit to this former Nazi concentration camp is a sobering experience. With around 200,000 people imprisoned here from 1936–45, it's a worthwhile stop for those studying WWII & Nazi Germany.

Checkpoint Charlie Museum

Named after the famous crossing point on the Berlin Wall, this museum demonstrates some of the the ingenious ways people snuck across border—plus stories about spies during the war.

Jewish Museum

The Jewish Museum provides a comprehensive understanding of historical anti-Semitism and the Holocaust, best for older students. It includes WWII artefacts, videos, and a learning center.

Memorial to the Murdered Jews of Europe

In central Berlin, close to the Brandenburg Gate, this memorial of 2,711 concrete blocks—the "Field of Stelae"—remembers six million Jewish Holocaust victims.

House of the Wannsee Conference

This house is historically significant as the place where the Nazis discussed the "final solution". Now a museum & memorial, it's an important destination for groups studying the Holocaust.

Stasi Museum

Cold War students will gain a real insight into East Berliners' lives at the Stasi Museum, showcasing the archives and former Minister of State Security's office.

The Story of Berlin

Discover 800 years of Berlin history in this interactive museum. Through 20 themed rooms, learn about everything from WWI & WWII to the Cold War, the Berlin Wall and reunification.



Topography of Terror

Topography of Terror, at the former SS central command site, remembers Jewish persecution during WWII with indoor and outdoor exhibitions depicting the Nazi era.

Underground Tour

Explore the hidden history of Berlin beneath Gesundbrunnen station on this epic underground tour. Don your hard hat and navigate a subterranean labyrinth full of surprises.

The German Museum of Technology

Fascinating exhibitions on aviation, shipping, railways, automobiles, film and the history of the computer. There's also exhibits on the pharmaceutical industry and much more.

IMAX Potsdamer Platz

Why not pass the evening with a German movie night at Cinestar Berlin IMAX? It's the largest multi-screen cinema in Berlin, situated within the bustling Sony centre.

Futurium

Futurium offers students a glimpse into future environmental, technological, and societal changes. Explore exhibitions on future living, work, and coexistence, with sustainable solutions.

Fernsehturm TV Tower

Ascend the TV Tower, an iconic symbol of East Germany's strength built in the 1960s. Berlin's tallest structure, it offers fantastic city views, and don't forget to enjoy the revolving café at the top!

Olympic Stadium Tour

Tour the historic Olympiapark Berlin, the stadium built for the 1936 Summer Olympics. Students will learn about the stadium's place in German and sporting history.

Berlin River Cruise

Embark on a leisurely cruise along the Spree River to take in the sights of Berlin from the water. Drift along on an echanting ride past famous sights such as the Reichstag.

Reichstag Building
