### Nausicaá National Sea Centre

The largest marine life centre in Europe is home to 1,600 species and promotes sustainability and marine management. This is a fun and educational cross-curricular visit for groups.

### Maison du Marais

Navigate through the Audomarois marsh, a UNESCO Biosphere reserve in Saint-Omer, on an awesome boat tour where you'll uncover the abundance of flora & fauna native to the wetland.

### Museum of Ceramics

Desvres has a thriving ceramics industry thanks to the area's raw materials. Enjoy a guided tour & partake in a workshop where students will learn about the production and craft their own souvenir.

### Desvres Arts & Crafts Village

A great opportunity to interact with the local community, your group can partake in a workshop in a creative discipline of your choice delivered in French or English by a local artist/maker.

### Treetop Adventure Park

Want to add a bit of adventure to your trip and give students a chance to overcome their fears? Add a visit to an outdoor activity centre where groups can climb, swing and soar through the great outdoors.

### Rando-Rail

Pedal your way through the French countryside along a 10 km-long disused railway track in a 4-person kart! This fun outdoor activity is a must if you're travelling in the summer.

### Outdoor Laser Tag

Team up and prepare for battle! Based in a safe, sandy, forested area, this outdoor laser tag game is great fun for groups. There's also a volleyball pitch and picnic area for students to eat lunch.

### Parc Bagatelle

Visit the oldest operating theme park in the whole of France! You'll find enough there to keep students of all ages entertained—not least the thrilling Triops rollercoaster.

### Bellewaerde

A short hop away in bordering Belgium, a day at Bellewaerde is all the theme park fun you'd expect—plus like going on safari, with animals like tigers and giraffes to gawk at dotted around the park.

### Mining History Centre

Housed in a former colliery, this museum explores the three centuries of coal mining in northern France. The highlight of the visit is undoubtedly the guided underground tour!

### Wellington Quarry

At The Carrière Wellington museum in Arras, students can walk the same network of WWI tunnels which were utilised by the British troops in a surprise attack on the Germans.

### Lochnagar Crater

This massive crater was created by the explosion of a mine during the WWI Battle of the Somme. The site has since been preserved to act as a war memorial dedicated to the fallen soldiers.

### La Coupole

This huge dome in the hills was built to house & launch rockets in WWII—now, it's a museum & planetarium. Learn the interesting story of how the mission pivoted from war to space exploration.

### Forteresse de Mimoyecques

The fortress of Mimoyecques was constructed as an underground launch site and intended as the base for a giant underground V3 super gun for an attack on England.

### Blockhaus d'Éperlecques

Located near Saint-Omer, this WWII bunker was built as a V2 rocket launch site. Your group can see the result of the ally bombing of the bunker and explore various in & outdoor exhibits.

### Museum of the Great War

In the heart of the Somme battlefields in Péronne, this museum investigates the human and social impact of the war and the ways in which life changed for fighters and civilians.

### Somme 1916 Museum

Want your students to get a greater understanding of the lives of soldiers during WWI? This museum, where the exhibits are housed in tunnels 10 metres underground, is your best choice.

### Musée de la Résistance

In a 19th-century fort that was occupied by German troops in WWI & WWII, students will learn about the fighters of the French resistance and how they worked with British Intelligence.

### Beaumont-Hamel Memorial

This WWI memorial marks where the British Army suffered their worst ever casualties in a single day. A bronze Caribou monument stands as the emblem of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

### Étaples Military Cemetery

Situated near Boulogne in Étaples, this Commonwealth War Graves Commission cemetery commemorates over 11,500 lives lost in WWI and WWII.

### Azincourt Medieval Centre

A great choice for younger students learning about medieval history, this museum focuses on the Battle of Azincourt and the Hundred Years' War.

### Thiepval Memorial

The largest British war memorial in the world is known as the "Memorial to the Missing". A moving tribute to the 72,000+ servicemen who died in the Battles of the Somme in WWI.

### Pozières Memorial

The village of Pozières was completely destroyed in the WWI Battle of the Somme. This memorial commemorates the more than 14,000 casualties of the battle.

### Delville Wood Cemetery

This First World War Commonwealth cemetery is notable due to the fact that more than half of the 5,500 buried remain unidentified. The South African National Memorial also faces the site.



The striking Canadian National Vimy Memorial is dedicated to the memory of the Canadian servicemen who lost their lives in WWI—particularly in the Battle of Vimy Ridge.
